Foreword

The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly impacted the activities of anti-doping organizations worldwide. As a result, anti-doping agencies such as POLADA had to adjust to working in the new conditions. Despite the adversities, the time of the pandemic has been used by the Polish Anti-Doping Agency in an appropriate way.

The program of out-of-competition doping controls often conducted on an individual basis was implemented. Disciplinary proceedings and investigation actions were continued. For information and education activities,

full use was made of e-learning software and remote learning platforms.

The doping controls brought first-ever results that detected the presence of EPO; the results were achieved in two cyclists. Because of the implementation of an intensive program of out-of-competition doping controls carried out on an individual basis, the identified number of whereabouts failures and so-called missed tests was greater than usual.

The year 2020 was largely devoted to the adjustment of the national regulations and policies to the revised World Anti-Doping Code that entered into force on 1 January 2021. The works were carried out simultaneously with regard to the legislative process concerning the Act on combating doping in sport and to POLADA regulations, including POLADA anti-doping rules. International-level activities were also continued, in particular in the field of cooperation with the World Anti-Doping Agency and the Council of Europe. Furthermore, POLADA has started finalizing its cooperation project with the Ukrainian Anti-Doping Center.

2020 was a difficult year but thanks to the determination of the POLADA team we have learned to function in exceptional circumstances and we were able to continue the national anti-doping program. Paradoxically, work in some areas such as enforcement of disciplinary liability for doping, or investigative activities, were carried out with greater intensity than in the years before the pandemic.




EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES


The pandemic and related contact restrictions have significantly hampered the organization of annual meetings with young athletes, held during the Juniors Championships of Poland and the National Youth Games finals. In 2020, many of the events were cancelled. Last year there were no possibilities either to visit many Sports Championship Schools or to meet directly with national team members at training camps. These problems resulted in a significant decrease in the number of training participants, as compared to 2018 and 2019.






Knowledge was passed to representatives of 21 sports of which the most active were:

- weightlifting (6 meetings),
- rugby and triathlon (3 meetings per sport),
- fencing, track and field sports, handball, field hockey, speed skating, short track, powerlifting, rowing and canoeing (2 meetings each),
- 3 training meetings for lawyers, doctors and sports activists were also held,
- 13 educational meetings for athletes with disabilities were conducted.

Notably, 2020 saw the largest number of meetings ever held with athletes with disabilities. This resulted from a significant increase in these athletes' interest in learning about anti-doping matters.

Doping Control Program



Prohibited substances detected

In 2020, 124 less substances, metabolites or markers were detected than in 2019 (76 substances in 2017; 106 substances in 2018, and 138 substances in 2019). The decrease in the number of detected substances was caused mainly by the fact that no doping controls were conducted in bodybuilding and fitness athletes. The reason was the loss of the status of Polish Sports Association by the Polish Bodybuilding, Powerlifting and Fitness Association.

Anti-Doping Rule Violations

In 2020, based on analytical evidence or non-analytical evidence, 16 proceedings were initiated with regard to anti-doping rule violations.



The chart above shows anti-doping rule violations by sport.

In 2020, 34 anti-doping rule violations were related to failure to provide whereabouts data or its incorrect entry into the monitoring system. In total, 29 filing failures and 5 missed tests were reported.

In 2020, 10 anti-doping rule violations detected based on analytical evidence were discovered.



International Cooperation


In 2020, the Polish Anti-Doping Agency carried out a number of activities in the international arena. All meetings apart from those held at the beginning of the year were held remotely. The main events from the POLADA international cooperation calendar are presented below.

COUNCIL OF EUROPE

POLADA together with the Ministry of Culture, National Heritage and Sport actively participated in works of the Monitoring Group of the Council of Europe's Anti-Doping Convention.
Representatives of the Polish Anti-Doping Agency were active in co-developing new policies regarding compliance, questionnaires, coherent international policy as well as cooperation between the Council of Europe and the World Anti-Doping Agency. POLADA also supported the evaluation of the compliance with the Convention in the Council of Europe individual member states.

CEADO

During the COVID-19 Pandemic the Central European Anti-Doping Organization (CEADO) was very active in the area of international anti-doping policy. The group's online meetings were held, on average, every two weeks and provided an opportunity for its members to exchange good practices and information on how to conduct doping controls in the time that was difficult for everyone. CEADO is composed of the national anti-doping organizations from: Austria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia and Hungary.

COOPERATION WITH THE UKRAINIAN ANTI-DOPING AGENCY

Cooperation between the Polish Anti-Doping Agency, World Anti-Doping Agency and Ukrainian Anti-Doping Agency, initiated in November 2018, continues to develop. Joint activities have resulted in the recognition of the Ukrainian Anti-Doping Agency as operating in compliance with WADA's World Anti-Doping Program. Achieving this goal required the development of appropriate regulations and a change of Ukraine's anti-doping policy. POLADA's role has been to support our Ukrainian counterpart in the strengthening of their national anti-doping system by sharing our experience and good practices. All the activities are monitored by WADA and the Council of Europe. The pandemic extended the process of finalizing the cooperation which is now expected to end in 2021.

COOPERATION WITH THE WORLD ANTI-DOPING AGENCY

The Polish Anti-Doping Agency has become a partner of the innovative WADA project "Global to Local". The aim of the partnership is to train over 100 specialists-anti-doping practitioners in Europe. The educational pilot project will help to increase the number and capacity of professionals working to protect clean sport.

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has signed a partnership agreement with the Polish Anti-Doping Agency (POLADA) to implement a pilot educational project "Global to Local" in Europe (G2L Europe). The program will focus on training anti-doping practitioners.

POLADA will provide WADA with support, including financial support, in the implementation of pilot training and development projects for over 100 experts-practitioners in Europe, working to protect clean sport, which will benefit the entire global anti-doping community.








In cooperation with the World Anti-Doping Agency and the Athletics Integrity Unit, a three-day training on results management and disciplinary proceedings in doping-related cases was held at the end of February 2020. The main goal of the joint initiative was to increase the quality of jurisprudence of the disciplinary bodies from Central and Eastern European countries, to get prepared for the implementation of the revised World Anti-Doping Code and to standardize the method of conduct of anti-doping proceedings.

The training was attended by nearly 40 representatives of national anti-doping agencies and disciplinary bodies from 9 countries: Austria, Croatia, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Russia, Slovakia, Slovenia and Ukraine.


